## **Berowra Station to Berowra Waters and return, Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> March, 2015**

The third day walk for the Cartophiles bushwalking club follows the Great North Walk 5½ km from Berowra Station down to Berowra Waters. We'll have lunch at Berowra Waters and then retrace our steps to the station. This is a walk we did in the first year of the Cartophiles, 2010, and haven't done since! The photo shows the Cartophiles enjoying the magnificent views across Berowra Creek to the Crosslands Reserve from the Naa Badu Lookout.



This walk follows the high ground above Berowra Creek, before finishing with a steep descent to the water's edge followed by a short walk to the ferry crossing at Berowra Waters. As the walk continues creek glimpses finally give way to the panorama of the boats and houses of Berowra Waters backed by forested ridgelines.

We'll meet at the Berowra Station car park at 10.00am on Saturday, 30<sup>th</sup> October. The walk will take 2-2½ hours each way. The walking is on fire trails and well formed tracks, and all the steep sections have formed steps. Because a couple of the climbs are steep it's rated moderate to hard.

There is water available at Berowra Waters but none along the way, so you will need to carry at least a litre of drinking water. Kit will carry a first aid kit. You should wear boots or stout walking shoes – if it's been raining some sections can be slippery. Bring a camera to preserve the memories.
